San Jose in Antipolo people live in different ways and have varied means of living. The more destitute ones live near the dumpsite with their family and relatives. Parents make a living by working through piles of garbage to retrieve recyclable materials for resale to traders. They don't mind the smell and toxic environment because the need

to survive is compelling. Bacteria, cockroaches, rats and flies are everywhere but those are very normal to them. Most of their houses are built with bamboo and tarpaulin. When storm comes these houses will easily collapse immediately. My heart breaks when I see innocent children experiencing severe poverty. Their eyes are asking for help. Christians in Action: Helping Super typhoon Yolanda Victims by Jochel Condestable

"This is what the LORD Almighty says: 'In a little while I will once more shake the heavens and the earth, the sea and the dry land. I will shake all nations, and what is desired by all nations will come, and I will fill this house with glory,' says the LORD Almighty –Haggai 2:6-7.

From the 7.2 magnitude earthquakes that shook Bohol came a new tragedy in the Philippines, last November 8, 2013, Friday. A super typhoon named "Yolanda" (international code name Haiyan) struck and brought calamity in the Philippines particularly in Eastern Visayas.

Most of the houses, buildings and roads were destroyed and ruined. Many families were abandoned and died. According to the news around 10,000 people may have died in Leyte alone. Many are still missing and presumed dead. Tacloban City the capital of Leyte province was one of the places that was heavily ravaged by the super

typhoon. It was crushed by the massive storm. There is no clean water, no electricity and very little food. Children are crying and suffering in severe hunger. God never wanted His children to suffer and experience such disaster and poverty. His ears are not deaf to hear His children's cry and His hands are not too short to help and reach His people.

November 12, 2013, Tuesday, C.A.R.E., Philippines gathered boxes of sardines, corned beef, noodles and 6 sacks of clothes. This was brought to ABS-CBN Sagip Kapamilya Foundation which took care of transporting and distributing them to victims.

This experience taught us of thinking of other people not only ourselves.

Though we are still young students, we can still help other people in need.
