It is composed of our "home-grown" children and youth who were taught the Bible and music education in our school at a very early age of six. Some of them are now young adults and serving the Lord full-time in our ministry; others are gainfully employed helping their families, the church and their communities.



September this year saw the Rondalla perform at the United Evangelical Church of Malabon, another faithful church partner for many years, led by Pastor Danny Reyes and Dr. Jean Go-Du, former Chair of the Philippine Board. Our own John Villanueva, conducting.

^{*}The Rondallla is an ensemble of string instruments played with a plectrum or pick. Originating from Spain, it is now a popular musical expression in many parts of the world including the Philippines. The word "rondalla" is from the Spanish "ronda", meaning "serenade". The string instruments include banduria, octavina, guitar, double bass and drums.

More blessings to thank God for:

San Antonio Chapel Dedicated

An outreach chapel measuring 200 square feet was built on a 2,000 square foot-lot which was dedicated and blessed recently by Pastor Joey Umali, Christian author and radio preacher, and member of the Board of Trustees of C.A.R.E., Philippines and Spiritual Advisor.

San Antonio, is a rural village, about 3 miles northwest of our Education Center and is also a very poor community where inhabitants, generally, have no education beyond elementary school level.

Families in extreme poverty cannot afford to buy even rice which is a staple food and, therefore, satisfy themselves eating root crops and boiled banana. Actually, there was no need to build this chapel if only the village people have enough money for the tricycle fare in going to our Education Center for Sunday services. Fifty children attend Sunday School regularly taught by our weekend missionaries.





Adjacent to the chapel is a 2-acre vacant lot for sale which would be suitable for vegetable farming. We are praying that in God's time, we will be able to purchase the lot so the church members can do vegetable farming for livelihood and daily food.

Another Outreach Church for the Lord and His Poor



A beach front half-acre property with three cottages owned by our children, Dr. Joel and Luchie was lent by the couple to C.A.R.E., Philippines for 10 years as a venue for a rural church to help the fishermen and the coconut farmers of the village.

The new church, presently shepherded by Pastor Vicky Perez with 4 volunteers, holds Sunday School classes to 70 children and conducts house-to-house Bible study 3 times a week. Aside from this outreach, there is no other evangelical witness in this remote community in Batangas province.

Our Lord Heals and Helps the Sick

Our Benevolence Ministry received a boost from our ministry partner, the Union Church of Manila with its generous cash donation to help at least five critically-ill children. After hearing the story of how we are helping the very sick children, an anonymous donor from UCM was moved to give a significant gift to add to our mission fund. Former Philippine Board member Mrs. Erlynn Campos remains to be our main connection with UCM.

Rose's "Retirement"

On September 17, 2017, by God's mercy and love, Rose completed her 30 years of ministry service as Executive Director. By normal standards, she should be retired and she did. Her retirement, however, is symbolic, from the title given her by men. For her, she remembers the "heart" of the mission given to her by the Lord – a personal call for her to serve Him until He calls her: to lead men, women and children to a saving faith in Jesus Christ, meaningful and strong enough for them to develop a direct and personal desire to improve their miserable situation relying on the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

"I thank the Lord for blessing me with a God-fearing and loving family; spiritual gifts and talents, a long life that at age 85 and Melo 86, we still have intact cognitive functions of working memory, decision-making, language, and logical reasoning. Our normal aging weaknesses of my AFib and slower gait and Melo's hearing loss and arthritis are under the care of our Lord Jesus Christ, our Jehovah Rapha, the HEALER. Then our doctor son Joel, his nurse wife Luchie and their doctor son Joshua and their medical associates, son Butch's daughter Michelle, a nurse, complements our family's medical team.

I am also inspired by the great Christian missionaries who spent their whole life serving Christ. Evelyn Brand is just among the many who sacrificed comforts and family in England to heed God's call to go to the mission field. She pioneered with her husband Jesse to reach five mountain ranges with the Gospel in the Mountains of Death in India.

Laboring together until Jesse's death, there were four more ranges to be reached and Granny Brand wanted to continue the work but was deterred by her Board who told her to "retire" because she was "old" at 68. She pleaded and went on not only to complete the five ranges for Christ, but added two more, despite a lot of physical pains, broken bones and discomforts. She tended the orphans, the sick and the needy for Christ until the Lord took her home in 1974, at the very ripe/old age of 95!

Granny Brand had a daughter and a son, Dr. Paul Brand who discovered new ways of treating leprosy, was also a famous surgeon and Christian author.

Lord-willing, I, too, would like to live out my remaining years by actively helping spread the Gospel and teaching the people that "obedience to Christ" is the most important priority of every Christian in this temporal world. My heart's desire is to continue helping our "home-grown, new generation" leaders become what God has intended them to be: to lead C.A.R.E., Philippines to many, many more years of *Sharing* His Word and *Caring* for God's poor for His glory.

I share the Psalmist's confidence that:

"I will see the goodness of the Lord In the land of the living." (Psalm 27:13)"

As C.A.R.E., Philippines Turns 31 years, Dr. Dick Todd Looks Back To...

Dr. Dick Todd, long time U.S.A C.A.R.E., Philippines' Board Chair writes:

"In September, 1987, 21 years ago, God put into the heart of a professor at the University of Illinois in Chicago (Dr. Rose Biron) and her husband, a Filipino lawyer practicing in Chicago (Melo Biron) a burden that would not go away—to work with the poorest of the poor in their native land even though this was not the life-style that they enjoyed prior to this time.

At the same time a High School Principal Jack Swanson in Oak Park, Illinois and his wife (Ellie Swanson) decided to go for part of a year working with the poorest of the poor somewhere in the world. Their faith led them to do this because of their son who had become a missionary to the poor in another country.

I put these two couples together to begin what would later be known as C.A.R.E., Philippines. The Swansons worked alongside Rose and Melo Biron for one year before leaving the Birons to continue directing the ministry."

Thank you, Dr. Todd for refreshing our memories on how our Lord began His ministry for our poor in the Philippines in 1987.

We have recalled the great and mighty deeds of God in enabling us—we, His missionaries in the forefront and you, on the sidelines cheering us up, always extending your prayerful and financial support to effect and enhance the physical and spiritual *transformation* of our poor.
